Press Release

Three arrests have been made regarding multiple mail and package theft investigations. On Friday, November 1st, deputies arrested four individuals believed responsible for thefts from Miller, Camden, and Morgan counties.

On Saturday, November 2nd, 2024, Miller County Deputies with the assistance of the Eldon Police Department executed a search warrant at a home in the 400 block of N. Mill St. During that search, deputies located multiple items believed to have been stolen from area mailboxes and porches.

The following individuals have been charged by the Miller County Prosecutor's Office as part of this investigation:

Tammy Schnieders 48, of Eldon with 1 count of Forgery a class D felony, 1 count of stealing postal or delivery items a class E felony, and 1 count of possession of a controlled substance a class D felony. She remains in custody at the Miller County Adult Detention Center with a total bond of \$60,000.

Rose Cooper 57, of Eldon with 2 counts of stealing postal or delivery items, a class E felony. She remains in custody at the Miller County Adult Detention Center on a \$10,000 bond.

Deborah Holloway 51, of Eldon with 1 count of Forgery a class D felony, and 1 count of stealing postal or delivery items a class E felony. She remains in custody at the Miller County Adult Detention Center on a \$25,000 bond.

Richard Schnieders 51, of Eldon with 1 count of possession of a controlled substance a class D felony. He remains in custody at the Miller County Adult Detention Center on a \$25,000 bond.

This is a multi-jurisdictional investigation, and we are working closely with surrounding agencies and the United States Postal Inspector. Additional charges are expected to be filed as the case develops and more victims are identified. Anyone who believes they have been a victim of mail theft within the last couple of months is urged to contact the Miller County Sheriff's Office at 573-369-2341 or their local agency to file a report.
